 - about 20 people attended.

 - Yes. IEEE-SA membership is needed for sponsor voting only.
 - If my affiliation is changed, is my attendance record for acquiring and retaining WG membership affected by the change?
 - No. All of IEEE 802 are Individual based.

- Did the participants have questions that were not answered in the slides?
 - I attended all of technical meetings during the WG session. But, I did not meet at least 75% presence, Why?
 - You have to be familiar with web-based 'IMAT' attendance tool.
 - Once you access it, you can see all the WG meetings including not only technical, but also opening and closing, and even related other WG meetings. So, you have to check percentage of your presence during the WG session.

 - In IEEE 802, If I get a voting membership of a specific WG, then am I qualified automatically as a voting member of other WGs?
 - No.

 - No.
