# Role of the ITU standing committee

# Objective

- Provide IEEE 802 input into IEEE-SA engagements with ITU
- Receive updates on IEEE-SA engagements with ITU
- Do not interfere with existing technical liaisons to ITU-T (e.g., in 802.1, 802.3)
- Do not interfere with existing regulatory and technical liaisons with ITU-R (e.g., in 802.18)

• The subgroup is responsible for assisting the Sponsor (e.g., drafting all or a portion of a document, drafting responses to comments, drafting public statements on standards, or other purely advisory functions).

    - IEEE-SA staff or volunteers may propose
  - Hold conference calls as needed between plenaries


# IEEE membership in ITU

## **IEEE** and ITU

- IEEE is a Sector Member of ITU-T, ITU-R and ITU-D
  - Participate in the work of ITU-T Study Groups, Working Parties and expert groups, seminars, round tables, colloquia and workshops
  - Attend ITU and ITU-T decision-making bodies (e.g., ITU Plenipotentiary Conference, World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly)
  - ITU Council granted no fee sector membership ~2002
- IEEE is classified as a "regional or other international organization"
- IEEE is qualified as
  - <u>ITU-T A.6</u> Cooperation and exchange of information with national and regional SDOs
  - <u>ITU-T A.5</u> Making reference to documents from other organizations.

## Register for a TIES Account

- Typically, volunteers get access under their company's membership
- Any IEEE 802 WG member may apply for a TIES Account under IEEE
  - Provides access to ITU-T documents

## Attendance at ITU

- Typically, volunteers attend under their company's membership
- Volunteer attendance at ITU meetings as an IEEE representative requires IEEE-SA approval
  - ITU-R liaison (Mike Lynch) has been approved

## 2023 Status

# Recent ITU conferences

## Virtual WSIS Forum 2023

- World Summit on the Information Society
  - ITU + UNESCO + UNCTAD + UNDP
    - discuss the role of ICTs to implement the UN Sustainable Development Goals



- ICTs for Well-Being, Inclusion and Resilience: WSIS Cooperation for Accelerating Progress on the SDGs
- 12-week agenda planned with 250+ sessions
  - in person 13-17 March
- Open Consultation process
  - Themes, Topics, Speakers, Workshops, Exhibits
  - IEEE SA is a Specific Activity Partner in 2022 & 2023
    - Includes thematic workshop, HL policy session, HL track facilitator
    - Previous IEEE 802 topic Time-Sensitive Networking in 2022

## Global Standards Collaboration

- The Governing Principles of GSC were updated in 2014.
   Membership in GSC is open to member-based organizations that are recognized or accredited to develop communications standards.
- GSC-23 was hosted by ETSI on 26-27 April 2023 in London, United Kingdom. Agenda focused on:
  - Value of Standards
  - Convergence of ICT and verticals
  - Metaverse

## Radio Advisory Group (RAG)

- advisory body to the study groups, membership and staff of ITU-R
  - review the priorities and strategies adopted in the Sector;
  - provide guidance for the work of the Study Groups
  - recommend measures to foster cooperation and coordination with other organizations and with the other ITU Sectors.
- In person May 2023
  - RAG currently has two correspondence groups and is part of another
    - Gender
    - Possible Revisions of Resolution ITU-R 1-8 (working methods)
    - Inter-Sector Coordination Group (ISCG)

# Key issues include

## Study Group matters

- RAG is very concerned about the growing trend in ITU-T, particularly its Study Groups 5, 13 and 20, of addressing matters (e.g., UAS and HAPS) that are uniquely within the mandates of ITU-R Study Groups
- Potential risk of the international framework lagging behind the fast developments in the industry

## Gender

- Discussion on implementation of gender mainstreaming
- Working methods
  - Updated for approval by RA
- WRC-23
  - Decided that RA and WRC will be in person only
    - · due to the risks it would pose to the successful conduct of the conference

# Telecommunication Standardization Advisory Group (TSAG)

- advisory body to the study groups, membership and staff of ITU-T
  - responsible for the working procedures defined in the A-series Recommendations and the organization of the ITU-T work programme.
  - Responsible for the work programme between WTSA
- In person May 2023

    - Working methods

# Key issues include

- SG restructuring (targeting WTSA-24)
  - Overlap of SG identified and discussed
    - Security, metaverse, IoT, ...
  - Organizational Reform (Res 99)
    - Use of metrics to guide restructuring abandoned
    - Proposals invited for WTSA-24
      - US  $\,$  reduced set of 8 SGs based on a thematic shuffling of questions
  - Digital Transformation formed as a TSAG RG (and not a FG or SG)
- Industry engagement
  - Update of Resolution 68 and the CTO/CxO meetings
  - Action plan and new steering group on Industry Workshop
- Working methods
  - Editorial changes for A.8 on the alternative approval process determined
  - Russia proposal to fix definition of "Open Standard" was not accepted
  - Agreed to defer inclusive language guidance to Council
- Coordination Groups
  - Standardization Programme Coordination Group (SPCG) with ISO/IEC

## ITU Council

- The Council acts as the Union's governing body in the interval between Plenipotentiary Conferences.
- Its role is to consider broad telecommunication policy issues to ensure that the Union's activities, policies and strategies fully respond to today's dynamic, rapidly changing telecommunications environment.

# ITU Council - July 2023

## Key issues

- Appointment of CWG chairs
- Financial Resource Management and the ITU Premises Building Project
  - Multiple building options fall back, status quo, rework
- Resolution 146 on the ITRs
  - mandate is simply to review (not revise)
- Resolution 130 on Cybersecurity
  - · Guidelines for the utilization of the Global Cybersecurity Agenda
- Resolution 167 on remote participation
  - · remote decision-making is too complex from a legal and practical perspective

## Council WG kick-off

- Elaboration of the draft Strategic Plan and draft Financial Plan
- Internet public policy, WSIS & SDGs, languages, ...
- EG-ITR will kick off the telecom regulation discussion, again...
- CWG-LANG is studying the inclusive languages issue

## ITU-R RA



- Radiocommunication Assembly 2023
  - 13 to 17 November 2023, immediately preceding WRC-23.
- Guidance
  - duties and functions Article 13 of the <u>Constitution</u> and Article 8 of the <u>Convention</u>
  - working methods § A1.2 of Resolution ITU-R 1-8.

## ITU-R RA

- Role of the Assemblies:
  - assign conference preparatory work and other questions to the <u>Study Groups</u>;
  - respond to other requests from ITU conferences;
  - suggest suitable topics for the agenda of future WRCs;
  - approve and issue <u>ITU-R Recommendations</u> and <u>ITU-R</u>

     Questions developed by the Study Groups;
  - set the programme for Study Groups, and disband or establish Study Groups according to need.

# IEEE 802 summary

- WSIS was a useful opportunities for policy engagement, capacity building and public visibility on IEEE 802 technologies at ITU
  - Time-Sensitive Networking workshop held at WSIS 2022
  - Opportunity for WSIS 2024 (hybrid Feb/Mar and in-person Mar)
- Given ITU new building project, opportunity for IEEE 802 to host ITU-T SG15 at future plenary
  - July 2026 in Montreal
